

It is the recommended programme of study for Catholic schools for Relationship and Sex Education, and has been written as a progressive scheme of work that supports the Religious Education, PSHE and Science curricula taught within the school.

Aims of Relationship, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)

Encourage pupils' growth in self-respect Understand that love is the central basis of relationships Acknowledge that we are all made in God's image

Understand the nature of relationships Help pupils to develop a healthier, safer lifestyle

Reflect on own relationships

Offer sex education in the wider context of relationships

Develop pupils' confidence in talking, listening and thinking about feelings and relationships

Prepare pupils to play active roles as citizens Acquire skills to develop and sustain relationships


Understand the nature of relationships

Ensure pupils protect themselves and ask for help and support when needed

Ensure pupils are prepared for puberty Help pupils to understand the Catholic vision of what it means to be citizens of the Kingdom of God

Programme Structure

The learning within the programme is broken into 5 aspects of human development:



Themes

Nursery Wonder at God's Love	Reception God loves each of us in our uniqueness	Year 1 We meet God's love in our family	Year 2 We meet God's love in the community
Year 3 How we live in love	Year 4 God loves us in our differences	Year 5 God loves me in my changing and development	Year 6 The wonder of God's love in creating new life

Organisation of Lessons

We set ground rules regarding positive behaviour.

We listen to questions and answers in a sensitive and sensible manner.

We treat each other with respect.

Children who do not follow ground rules or attempt to embarrass or hurt another child deliberately will be asked to leave. Small group teaching for some elements of the programme.

All children will cover the same topics.

Lessons may include discussions, presentations, questions and written work.

Single sex group teaching where appropriate.

Summary of Learning

Physical

Focus on body parts, colours, shapes and features.

Spiritual

Focus on the wonders of God's world, see their special place as part of the wonder of God's creation.

Nursery



Wonder at God's Love

<u>Social</u>

Look at how we are special, our similarities and differences.

Intellectual

Focus on the cause of happy and sad feelings, looking at expressions.

Emotional

Observe facial expressions, focusing on individual expressions and discover the beauty of their smile.

Physical

Focus on how we are special and different, being friendly to others.

Spiritual

Consider how Jesus is our friend, how God shows love to me and my family, celebrations and church celebrations.

Reception



God loves each of us in our uniqueness

Social

Look at who we play with and why, explore favourite games, why we are special to our families.

Intellectual

Explore why it is important to have friends, describe a good friend.

Emotional

Explore how we feel about friends at home and at school, who we would go to if we needed help.

Summary of Learning

Physical

Explore who is in my family, what a happy family consists of, how our families keep us healthy, how we change from a baby.

Spiritual

Recognise that we are members of God's family, how we are made in the image of God, how we are loved and cared for by God.

Year 1



We meet God's love in our family

Emotional

Explore happy and sad moments in our families, how love is shown in our families.

Social

Explore how love is shown in our families, why using manners is important, showing respect, keeping safe and mending broken friendships.

Intellectual

Focus on why we need to grow up in families, why we should always tell the truth.

Physical

Belonging to communities, safety, secrets, using internet safely.

Spiritual

How we should treat others as children of God, school mission statement, helping others in need, meeting God in the community.

Year 2



We meet God's love in the community

Emotional

How communities help us develop feelings and emotions, what we bring to our communities.

Social

Importance of belonging to a community, how individuals enrich our communities, learning from others, roles and responsibilities.

<u>Intellectual</u>

Loneliness within a community, advantages of being on our own.

Summary of Learning

Physical

Look at who takes care of us, how we look after ourselves, how we are changing, what healthy friendships look like.

Spiritual

Look at the story of Zacchaeus, how Jesus accepted him, welcomed and forgave him, how we can do the same, and forgiveness.

Year 3



How we live in love

Emotional

How we feel when friends aren't there for us. Qualities of a true friend, how friendships change, being supportive.

Social

Keeping ourselves safe, helping others, making and keeping friends, how my friends make me feel happy and secure.

Intellectual

Recognise the difference between being alone and being lonely, recognising the need for personal privacy.

Physical

Recognise that we grow and develop at different rates, challenging stereotypes, dignity of the person.

Spiritual

Recognise how we are unique, what our special gifts are, what our qualities and talents are, why honesty, truthfulness and integrity are positive attributes.

Year 4



God loves us in our differences

Emotional

Recognising how to appreciate our own gifts, talents, achievements and all that makes us unique, appreciating the gifts of others, dealing with a range of emotions.

Social

Learning to accept and celebrate who we are, accepting difference in others, managing conflicts, being polite and courteous, staying safe in the community, people who help us.

Intellectual

Identifying and naming my feelings, understanding what they are, how to deal with what we feel, analysing our feelings and actions.

Physical & Intellectual

Recognising the emotional, internal and external changes that happen during puberty, changing hygiene routines, good personal hygiene, physical contact being appropriate, inappropriate or unsafe, recognising God's love that journeys with us.

Summary of Learning

Year 5



God loves me in my changing and development

Social & Emotional

Recognising
behaviour changes
as we grow up,
how this may
affect friendships,
being more
sensitive to our
emotional
development, selfesteem, reporting
concerns, looking
after our mental
wellbeing, staying
safe online.

Spiritual

Learning about what it means to grow holistically, how we can ensure each aspect happens healthily, challenges we might face as we change and grow, being respectful to our bodies.

Spiritual

Focus on the characteristics of positive respectful relationships. building relationships online, positive and negative information online, recognising risks online and how to report them, appropriate boundaries within friendships, contributing to the wellbeing of others, discovering the presence of God in family and friends.

Year 6



The wonder of God's love in creating new life

Social & Emotional

Understanding what love is, what it means to be patient, kind and never jealous, not being boastful, conceited or seeking advantage, grievances, what it means that love finds joy in the truth and never comes to an end.


Physical

Focus on the key building blocks in a loving relationships, how conception takes place.

Difficult Questions

There are specific areas that we feel are not appropriate to discuss within the context of our school lessons as our children are not yet emotionally mature to handle these issues. We also ensure that all of our lessons are in line with Catholic teaching.

If a child asks a question outside the scope of our programme, it will be dealt with in a sensitive and caring manner. We would always encourage the children concerned to discuss the issue with their parents.
